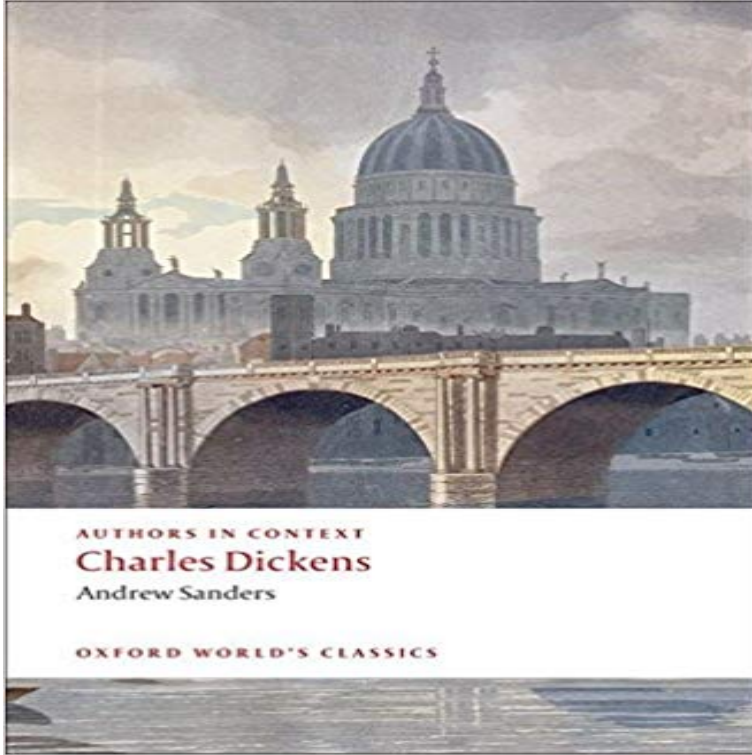


Charles Dickens (Authors in Context) (Oxford Worlds Classics)
