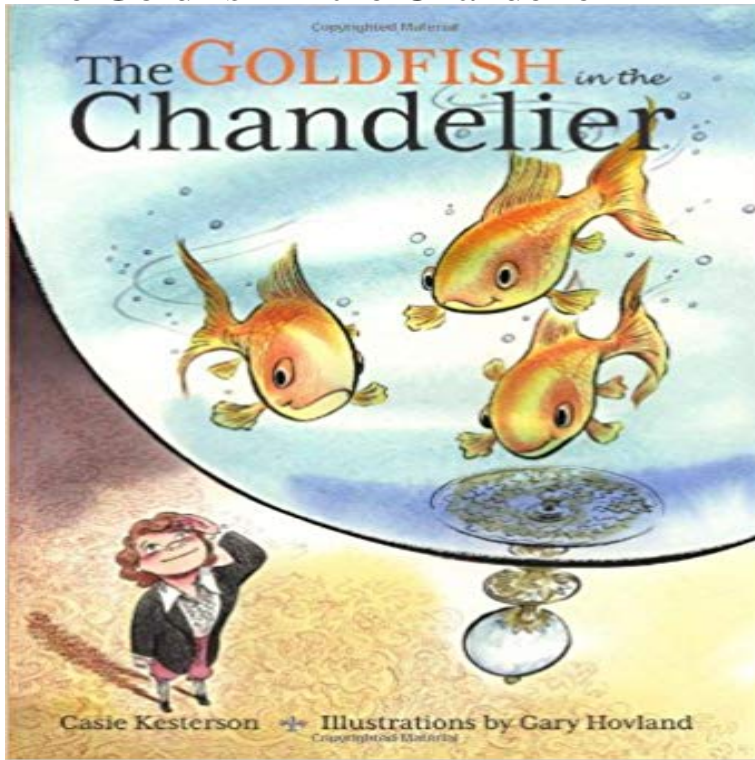


# The Goldfish in the Chandelier
